Hello Grace Family,

In the gripping naval/spy movie "Hunt for Red October" (1990) the race is on to track down the Russian submarine, Red October, as the crew makes use of their cutting-edge stealth propulsion system to evade the American and Russian navies.

There is one scene that I would like to draw your attention to. During their evasive maneuvers, Red October navigations officer, Kamarov, makes the following statement: "Give me a stopwatch and a map, and I'll fly the Alps in a plane with no windows!"

Timing is essential when it comes to navigation. Marine chronometers are precision timepieces that have been used since the 1700s to determine a ship's longitudinal position in relation to Greenwich Mean Time. Accurate knowledge of the time over a long voyage, along with gazing into the heavens to see the position of various constellations, helped determine a ship's exact location.

A watch which uses a quartz crystal is very accurate for everyday use, but it can lose about one thousandth of a second over the period of six weeks. Thankfully, since ships move relatively slowly (20-30 miles per hour), any error in navigation can be quickly corrected using visual cues or landmarks. But what would happen if we had something traveling a little faster?

The NASA Space Shuttles can reach speeds upward of mach-20 (15,300mph). The Voyager spacecraft is capable of speeds more than mach-54 (41,700mph). If a standard quartz watch is used to assist in navigating a spaceship traveling at this speed, the craft could be off course by as much as 200 miles over a period of six weeks. To combat this inaccuracy, the scientists at NASA have developed the "Deep Space Atomic Clock". This clock uses mercury ions which are fifty times more stable than atomic clocks on GPS satellites.

Now you might be wondering: As interesting as this is, what's your point? Consider the Lord's words on Day 4 of creation:

And God said, "Let there be lights in the expanse of the heavens to separate the day from the night. And let them be for signs and for seasons, and for days and years, and let them be lights in the expanse of the heavens to give light upon the earth." And it was so. Genesis 1:14-15 ESV

The Lord set the stars and planets in their places to benefit those observing from the earth. He placed them to follow a specific path with predictable movement through the heavens. Astronomers can predict with pin-point accuracy the movement and trajectory of any heavenly body for years to come due to the incredible precision with which they move. Humanity's most accurate atomic clocks need to be checked against the movement of the planets to correct their inaccuracies, yet skeptics will look at the splendor of creation and make the claim: "There is no evidence for a Designer or Creator!"

Consider the words of the psalmist:

"The heavens declare the glory of God, and the sky above proclaims his handiwork. Day to day pours out speech, and night to night reveals knowledge. There is no speech, nor are there words, whose voice is not heard. Their voice goes out through all the earth, and their words to the end of the world." Psalm 19:1-4 ESV

When you experience moments of doubt, pause and look up. Consider the handiwork of the Lord and trust Him.




