
















## When we miss God's Heart.

There are many times in our lives when we miss God's heart because it is *crowded out by our sin*. Instead of being able to see God's grace and kindness toward us through His actions, we often only see harshness or unkindness.

A perfect example of this is found in the Genesis 3:21 account of God coming to Adam and Eve after they have sinned, and acting, in our view perhaps, unkindly, harshly or even cruelly, by killing an innocent animal to use its skin to cover mankind's nakedness.

It is easy for us to say that God should have not killed an animal to cover mankind, and that certainly he could have found a more suitable way to deal with the problem. After all, God could have even left them naked. But the point of the covering is easily missed if we always **point fingers at God for doing things the way that we wouldn't.** 

So why the dead animal?

God, by the clothing of mankind, was **covering their shame.** The death of the animal was a foreshadowing, a prophetic picture of what was to come – that of the sacrificial death of a symbolic "lamb" – the sacrifice that would ultimately cover mankind's shame once and for all the ages to come and into eternity. What God did once to remove the shame of two persons was representative of what Jesus would do forever to remove the entirety of mankind's shame. The writer to the Hebrews, in Hebrews 13:12-13 writes, "so Jesus also suffered outside the gate (a symbol of the uncleanness of sin) in order to sanctify the people through his own blood. Therefore, let us go to him outside the camp and bear the reproach he endured,". There are two key points to remember here.

Firstly, the people who lived outside the camp of Israel were traditionally those suffering a physical malady which made them unclean to worship God. Their presence at worship was thought to taint the holiness of God's people. This **holiness** is what allowed people to enter the temple to worship. At that time, it was thought that physical maladies were a manifestation of sin, either committed by the afflicted people or against them.

Jesus, however, constantly went to those outside the camp of Israel. Either they were Samaritans, Romans, women, paralytics, lepers, demoniacs, tax collectors or just Jewish sinners. Jesus went to all and, instead of being tainted by their uncleanness, **he offered them forgiveness from sin** or freedom from the curse of oppression or sickness. *He affected them*, not the other way around. *His righteousness clothes them* - not by covering their shame - *but by removing it*.

And now, instead of us hiding from the Father, we are able to approach him in the holiness of Jesus Christ and freely worship him. As John writes in The Revelation, "the sacrificial blood of the Lamb has overcome!"

### "Live Your Truth & Other Lies"

**Have you ever wondered** about the catchy little phrases we hear these days? "Live your truth" is one that has become ever so common. People throw this phrase around to signal their supposed virtuous "tolerance", but it is often just a code for excusing sin. How can one person have a "truth" that is different from someone else's "truth"? The simple answer is that you can't. Truth refers to that which is true or is in accordance with reality. So, it is erroneous to believe that you can have your own truth. You can certainly have your own values or opinions or ideas, but you cannot have your own truth.

There are many other phrases and words that are used in our current culture that have been altered to mean something else. As an interesting exercise, go online and use the Webster's 1820 dictionary and compare word definitions with a current online dictionary. Some definitions have only changed slightly but some have been overhauled in a major way. If words are how we communicate and their meaning is constantly changing, we can find ourselves in a situation where we begin agreeing with lies. This might be unintentional, but Satan is subtle and can use words to deceive us and others to lead us down a path of deception.

Alisa Childer's "Live Your Truth and Other Lies" is a book that tackles ten common phrases that have been circulating in our current culture. In the book, Childers looks at the origins of these phrases, including the underlying influence of postmodernism, and shines the light of God's Word to expose their deception. **God's Word is not silent on the issues of our day**, and we must be like the noble Bereans who examined carefully what Paul and Silas were sharing with them to make certain that it was in accordance with Scripture (Acts. 17:11,12). We too need to be diligent to examine the Scriptures to know what is true and what is not.

If you are interested in learning more about the background of some of the lies circulating in our culture and what God's Word says in response, come and join me for a six-week dive into this topic. 
